Henry Judah Heimlich was born on February 3, 1920. One hundred years later, his name is still associated with a number of critical medical inventions and benefits.

Of course, the Heimlich Maneuver® comes to mind as one of those benefits – we see "the Heimlich" depicted in movies and tv shows, or as a reference when our sports team comes up short.
